

**ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 2-148
OF THE LAPORTE COUNTY CODE,
LAPORTE COUNTY COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS BOARD**

WHEREAS, LaPorte County Community Corrections Board by statute consists of nineteen (19) members;
and


WHEREAS, there is a need for more continuity of management of the Community Corrections Program on a regular recurring basis;

NOW THEREFORE, the LaPorte County Board of Commissioners now amend Section 2-148, LaPorte County Code as follows:


1. Amend Section C (8) (f) as follows: four (4) lay persons, at least one (1) of whom must be a member of a minority race if a racial minority resides in the County and a member of that minority is willing to serve and one (1) of who may be a County Commissioner.
2. Add i. as follows: Community Corrections Advisory Board will create an executive committee consisting of not less than three (3) or more than five (5) members of the Community Corrections Advisory Board. The executive committee will consist of a County Commission member, a County Council member and one (1) Judge if such persons are willing to serve on such executive committee. The Chairman of the Community Corrections Advisory Board by virtue of his position will automatically be a member of the executive committee. The Community Corrections Advisory Board will adopt procedures and guidelines for use by the executive committee to assist the Community Corrections Director in managing the day-to-day affairs of the Community Corrections Program. The purpose of the Community Corrections executive committee is to allow for management continuity between the executive director of the Community Corrections Program and the Advisory Board.
3. In the event that a lay vacancy under Section One above does not exist to allow for an immediate appointment of a County Commissioner to the advisory board, the advisory board may consist of twenty (20) members until such time that the first lay appointment becomes vacant or expires as a result of term limit, resignation or otherwise at such time the advisory board will then be limited to Nineteen (19) members.
4. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, posting and publication as provided by law if applicable.
5. That any other Ordinance not in conflict with this Ordinance is hereby repealed and rescinded.



