## LAPORTE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

Tuesday, December 8, 2009

The LaPorte County Board of Commissioners met in a regular meeting on Tuesday, December 8, 2009, at 6:00 p.m. in the LaPorte County Complex Meeting Room #3.

### CALL MEETING TO ORDER

Mrs. Huston, President, called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

### PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mrs. Reathel Noveroske led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mrs. Huston, please remain standing for a moment of silent prayer for our troops & peace throughout the world.

### ROLL CALL

All present

### APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Mr. Layton made a motion to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by Mr. Bohacek, motion carried by voice vote 3-0.

### APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mr. Bohacek made a motion to approve the minutes of November 17, 2009, seconded by Mr. Layton, motion carried by voice vote 3-0.

### WEEKLY REPORTS

The Commissioners review and sign the weekly reports during the meeting.

### CLAIMS

Payroll Ending December 11, 2009, Mr. Layton made a motion to approve, seconded by Mr. Bohacek, motion carried by roll call vote 3-0.

Miscellaneous Claims—\$1,019,546.00, Mr. Bohacek made a motion to approve as presented, seconded by Mr. Layton, motion carried by roll call vote 3-0.

### PUBLIC COMMENTS

Mr. Mark Yagelski, County Council President, on the agenda, I don't see the contract on the Economic Development group.

Mrs. Huston, that will be on the agenda for next week.

Mr. Yagelski, that is a day meeting so if you don't mind I would like to comment on that tonight.

In talking with Mrs. Sosinski and Mr. Garner who couldn't make it tonight, we have not had a chance to see the contract and see what was actually in it. I wanted to see if we could get a joint meeting together because there are things in the contract that we are not in agreement with. Secondly, there have been questions on both LaPorte and Michigan City having the use of Matt Reardon. You just don't turn on a switch one day and turn it off the next. We are still in support of using Mr. Reardon's services.

Mr. John Scarborough, 6985 S. Union Mills, IN, I would like to know why the railroad has no rules. They did open the crossing on Long Lane today at 1:00 p.m. It has been closed three months for a minor derailment. For the first six weeks they did nothing, it took two weeks work to get the job done. Why can't the Sheriff get some authority to take care of the railroads? It is 4.7 miles from the north side of the crossing to the south side. This is not the first crossing that has been closed for months. CSX is terrible. The Grand Trunk takes 7 to 10 days to get a crossing out and back in. The CSX has no consideration for the people in Union Mills. There are three school buses that use that route. They have to maintain the rails, but they could have a little consideration for the people in the territory.

Mrs. Huston, this was brought to our attention during several previous meetings. Our attorneys did work on it and they reported to us this morning that it would be open today. I got a call from Donnelly's office, they also went to the Federal Railroad Administration. If it had not been opened today, I was to call them back. We have no authority over this, it is a federal railroad.

Mr. John Regetz, Executive Director, Michigan City Economic Development and Tim Gropp, Executive Director, of the Greater LaPorte Economic Development Corp. We would be happy to continue our review of the agreement of our Economic Development services and spell out what our staffing plans are to accomplish the goals laid out in our proposal.

Mr. Bohacek, during the workshop you made a comment that one of the reasons we can't put this all under one roof and have one Economic Development Agency in the county was that you have a contract with a service for x amount of years. Is this the delay?

Mr. Regetz, this is a three year process outlining our options for consolidation and services.

Mr. Bohacek, why is three years the magic number, it seems like a long time to integrate two offices. It would be nice to have one agency.

Mr. Regetz, we have several organizations to coordinate in that regard. It is just a process we have to go through. We will have a consultant on board as we go through this as we just don't flip the switch.

Mr. Bohacek, I think we need to find out how fast we can push this together so we can have one agency. I would like to see that time line accelerated maybe within a year.

Mr. Tim Gropp, we are filling in the gaps and what is before you is a proposal of services to fill out the Economic Development Services of LaPorte County and create some coordination in the process. We put out what services are missing in LaPorte County and needs to be upgraded. We are here to help LaPorte County. Our two entities have come together; our two boards have come together.

Mr. Earl Cunningham, County Council, second district. I would like to give you each a small packet. First of all I would like to apologize to the Commissioners for the undo criticism you are receiving from the local media through no fault of your own since you had nothing contractual to do with the RPM Fest. We are in a unique situation here, because I don't know if anyone in the state of Indiana has the experience that Mr. Layton has as serving as a Sheriff, Auditor, and Treasurer. If you go to page one, highlighted is #9, "any other purpose that benefits the sheriff's department that is mutually agreed upon by the county fiscal body and the county sheriff". On page two is an email to Senator Arnold from Bruce Hartman, CPA, State Examiner, it says, "As the two of you discussed, during an audit of the county, we would not take exception to the payment of sheriff department employee overtime worked if it is shown to benefit the sheriff's department and is mutually agreed upon by the county council and the county sheriff. The same is true for the payment to EMS employees for their work". At our last council meeting, Sheriff Mollenhauer took exception to the fact that he didn't know who Bruce Hartman was and maybe Tammy White was Bruce Hartman's boss. I think Mr. Layton is well aware that that is not the case. In this particular letter it says, "County general fund and commissary funds are public funds; therefore, accountability and transparency are owed for all disbursements made. These funds cannot be used for personal purposes including donations and other disbursements

that may be for good causes". The State Examiner is telling you that you can do it. Mr. Layton, as a former sheriff, if you saw in an email from the State Board of Accounts Examiner, would you have felt that was authority to pay out of the commissary funds?

Mr. Layton, I would not take exception to it.

Mr. Cunningham, in your former capacity of Auditor or Treasurer, if you saw those same words, would you not take exception to it?

Mr. Layton, yes sir.

Mr. Bohacek, the Commissioners do not have any authority in this whatsoever. As you try to compel the sheriff to use commissary funds to pay these wages, how are we going to address overtime, unemployment, pension, and liability? We just can't hand them a payroll check. Do we give them a 1099 at the end of the year?

Mr. Cunningham, I don't care how they get paid. We only have three choices; we can pay out of tax funds, we can take no action and wait for a potential law suit, or give the sheriff permission to pay the deputies and EMS out of the commissary funds. Our vote was to give him the authority to use the commissary funds.

Mrs. Huston, if you remember, back at your July meeting, all of the council voted no to pay the officers out of any of the funds. The point being, these employees work for the county already. We did not enter into any contract. How is it the county's responsibility or the sheriff's to pay out of the commissary funds? I could see if this benefited ALL deputies or EMS employees to possibly take it out of the commissary funds.

There is a discussion about the use of commissary funds and how to pay the officers.

Matt Bernacchi, County Council at large. There is no contract signed. We want to solve this problem, but not in court. We are trying to find a reasonable way to get out of this without using tax dollars. This is the only way we see to do it.

Mr. Layton, I agree that everyone wants these officers and EMS personnel to be paid. I think there has been an avenue opened by the council for that payment to be made, however, this body cannot make that determination until the sheriff of this county agrees with the council.

Sheriff Mike Mollenhauer, I would like to make a short comment to Mr. Cunningham's accusations. The email that was read from Tammy White says it is not a legal opinion, contact your county attorney. I did so. I also contacted our association attorney, Howard Williams. They both advised to work this out. Don't do it right now, you are leaving yourself and the council out to dry. I met with Mr. Willoughby and he has worked very, very hard on this. There is an email to Mr. Baugher from Mr. Willoughby on 12-7-09 at 9:07 a.m. which said, I spoke with attorney Paul Oates general council for the state board of accounts this morning. Attorney Oates, after speaking with Tammy White and researching this matter further, also appears to have reservations about paying from the commissary fund for services provided at the RPM Fest. He also confirmed that Tammy was responding to two different questions in her emails. The ultimate answer is that there is no clear solution to our situation. There is additional concern on setting a precedent from paying employees from this fund. I would like to see the officers paid, EMS, and Scipio Township Fire Department. We are not allowed legally to pay the employees out of this fund right now. That word came from the County Deputy Attorney, Chris Willoughby. It goes on to say, money disbursed from the fund under this subsection must be supplemental or in addition to, rather than a replacement for, regular appropriations made to carry out the purposes listed in subdivision 1 through 8. I have not violated the law in my 42 years in law enforcement, I am not going to start now. If I can be advised that it is legal, I will be happy to pay.

Mr. Cunningham, Mr. Layton, one more time. If you received something from the state examiner that you had permission to pay, why do you need to go get a lawyer's opinion?

Mr. Layton, if I was in Sheriff Mollenhauer's shoes, I would probably have paid the officers and EMS. I am not Sheriff Mollenhauer and that is his decision.

Charles Sidlecki, I am the Chicago attorney Mr. Cunningham reference to. I am a resident of LaPorte County. The officers who signed up for that event responded to a posting on letterhead from Sheriff Mollenhauer's office requesting they work a detail. I have offered to represent these officers free of charge. There would be no cost to the county if they just resolve it. It is public record that the sheriff requested a bond. Someone ignored the request for a bond that resulted in this fiasco.

Mr. Mark Yagelski, it was proposed at the last county council meeting that we take direction from the commissioners that the paperwork says it will be this way from now on.

Mrs. Huston, the contract that was drawn up for the officers, yes. We need to be very consistent.

Mr. Layton, your being president of the council and with our commission president here, it seems to me there is a lot of contention on this agreement that we want to join with Michigan City and LaPorte. We have this scheduled for our meeting next week. I would be willing to removing it from our next weeks agenda if you and Mrs. Huston could set a time for all of us to set down on this issue.

Mr. Yagelski, that would be good. It was rushed in because of budgetary issues.

Mr. Richard Mrozinski, LaPorte County Council, the council has two things in mind. We all agree that the deputies and the EMS people need to be paid. We are concerned with the threats to sue the county because that is tax payer's money. On your agenda tonight, item D. ALCO contract. Channel 97, we are footing the bill for government meetings, we want them aired live. We have never funded channel 99, which is only available in Michigan City. Why should the tax payers have to pay for any of it since it is not available in LaPorte, even channel 97 is not available to everyone in the county.

#### DEPARTMENT HEAD COMMENTS

Mr. Tony Hendricks, LaPorte County Surveyor, I have given you a map of Welnetz Road and want to inform you on what is going on. At the town of Trail Creek's board meeting there were a lot of residents concerned about what is going on. Jeff Wright and I went out there last week. We have permission from IDEM, the Army Corp and the DNR. The only thing that might delay this project is the large trees and overhead power lines. I would like the commissioners to go to the town board meeting to get support for this project and about if there is a cost, sharing the cost of this. The town of Trail Creek's board meeting is December 16, 2009 at 6:00 p.m.

Mr. Layton, for your information, I contacted Don Babcock from NIPSCO in reference to this easement and the amount of large trees in there and expressed to him that there was no way that we had the equipment or know how to take those trees down in their extension wires. He put me in touch with Roger Van Schoyck who is in charge of the forestry division of NIPSCO. He will be available to meet on this issue when he gets back in town on Thursday. We will have some knowledge on where NIPSCO is going to stand on this. I don't know if we have the rights to enter on their easement yet.

Mr. Hendricks, Dennis Metheny and Ed Muzyka are going door to door. I have offered my help if they need it.

Mr. Hendricks, in regard to the emergency call list, I talked with Andy Reyna from IT and he said he can post on the LaPorte County website.

Mrs. Huston, we call Darlene from IT and she can take care of that.

Mr. Jeff Wright, Highway Engineer, I have given you a hard copy sketch of Tiffany Woods. There is equipment on site to install that over the next couple of weeks. This is just information if someone should call you. We are going to raise the grade of the street 18 inches, but that won't happen until this spring. The excavator was out there yesterday and will work as time and weather allows.

Mr. Layton, have you been contacted by Ray Hamilton about this project? He had a phone call from an attorney representing the abutting property owners to the north and to make sure that we stayed off of their land. According to Mr. Hamilton, the attorney was saying that the easement is no longer there.

Mr. Hendricks, here is a picture and it still shows the easement. We are working on our easement.

Mr. Wright, I left a small set of plans at your office for 421 and 400 S. The drawings are out for bid. We will receive bids on December 29, 2009. It is 100% funded by the state. The project won't be awarded until February, 2010.

Mr. Layton, I want to thank Mr. Bohacek for sitting in on the wage and hour meeting. Secondly, I want to thank you, Mr. Wright, for your tenacity of getting the 400 North project completed.

Mr. Layton made a motion to concur with the county council on their resolution for a hiring freeze with an exception on paragraph 2, it specifically refers to the common council and that should say county council, seconded by Mr. Bohacek, motion carried by roll call vote 3-0.

### NEW BUSINESS

#### Receive and Open Bids for Farm Ground Lease

Mr. Layton made a motion to close the bids, seconded by Mr. Bohacek, motion carried by voice vote 3-0.

Mr. Braje, first bid from Rob Lawrenz, \$24,084.70 for 106.1 tillable acres. Next bid from Tom Parker is \$13,886.00 based on 106 tillable acres. Last bid from Spring Mill Farms, David Thompson, \$17,082.10 for 106.1 acres.

#### Attorney Ralph Howes/Petition to Vacate a Portion of Kolar Drive

Mr. Jonathon Howes, I'm here on behalf of Ralph Howes. Mr. Larry Stevens respectfully petitions the Commission to vacate a portion of Kolar Drive. We have a copy of the publication notice, and notices were sent to two adjoining land owners. Mr. Terry Stevens is here in support of the petition and one notice returned undeliverable. They are asking for the county to vacate the undeveloped portion of Kolar Drive. There is not a road there; there has never been a road there. This would benefit the Stevens' so they can make improvements to that land.

Mr. Braje, Is there a legal description for the portion that you want vacated?

Mr. Howes, we can get that done and provide a legal.

Mr. Braje, you have to have some end point in the description. I think it would be a good idea to table this and get a legal description for that and then the commissioners can consider that. For the record, Mr. Howes has provided the publication, notices and delivery receipts.

Mr. Layton made a motion to table, seconded by Mr. Bohacek, motion carried by voice vote 3-0.

Al Ott, Stationary Engineer/Bid Recommendations

Mr. Layton, we were informed that in the bid specs there was no remedy for recycling the glass from the windows. We would have to contact Mr. Bishop on that so that we comply with the grant.

Mr. Layton made a motion to approve the recommendations of Mr. Ott, seconded by Mr. Bohacek, motion carried by voice vote 3-0.

ALCO Contract

Mr. Layton, I asked this to be put on the agenda to discuss publicly. The meeting we had with Mayor Oberlie from Michigan City was a public workshop. The city of Michigan City is going out for public bids or requests for proposals on channel 99, channel 98 is the school channel and channel 97, all three of them. I know the county is obligated to a three year contract with ALCO currently that was signed in July 2008.

Mr. Bohacek, Channel 98 is exempt from this.

Mr. Layton, I would like to include the county in that request for proposals that the City of Michigan City is putting out. There is an escape clause in the contract that we have with ALCO if there is a cheaper or better system that would come in. I would also ask that the council be included. It is a viable tool for a lot of people. It is a way for them to see what is going on.

COMMISSIONER'S COMMENTS



Mrs. Huston, it is snowy out, please have a safe trip home.



Dear Commissioners,

There are a few questions I would have before a contract is signed the work commences;

- 1) In speaking with Al Ott, not one of the contractor's within their sealed bid addressed recycling of the old ballasts, lamps, and/or windows. This was specially addressed within the invitation to bid which was advertised. I have attached a recycling company quote that releases death certifications for each ballast and lamp recycled. Probably a good thing to show the Department of energy once audit time commences. The consultant selected needs to make sure everything is recycled, reused, or stored for a later date as stated in the invitation to bid.
- 2) Any contractor hired must report quarterly on their grant money received and utilized via the following website: [www.federalreporting.gov](http://www.federalreporting.gov). The reporting must be done under the sub-recipient category for the La Porte County grant award.
- 3) There are also a couple items I will need to go over with the selected contractor after a contract is signed. These include weekly payroll certifications, random interviews of employees, and Federal Department of Labor posters.
